WHAT THE KITCHEN NEEDED

A SMARTER LAYOUT

Homeowners Gina and Brian Bishop of Hudson, Ohio, love to cook, but a winding, inefficient kitchen with a super-small sink and low countertops made things difficult. Even worse, an adjacent bathroom was in plain view while eating.

LIGHT! A dark (and impractical) wallpapered backsplash, butcher block countertops, and wide-plank maple walls cast a dreary shadow on the room.

BETTER STORAGE The awkward layout didn't allow for a pantry—something Gina always wanted. And the old wood drawers often splintered when opened, making it difficult to get her hands on cooking tools.
